▲ **Annette Taddeo** was born in Colombia and came to the United States when she was seventeen. She taught Spanish at the University of North Alabama for a few years, and in 1992 moved to Miami to begin a career as a translator. Since 1995, she has run her own translation company, Language Speak, offering translation services in over 100 languages. In 2005 she was named "Businesswoman of the Year" at the Success Strategies for Businesswomen Conference.



▲ **Enrique Iglesias** Born in Madrid, Spain, Enrique Iglesias moved to Miami when he was 8 years old. Son of the singer Julio Iglesias, Enrique kept his desire to follow in his father's footsteps a secret until he had secured a deal with a recording company. After a year at the University of Miami, he came out with his first album in 1995. He soon became the biggest-selling Spanish-language artist in the world. His fourth album, *Enrique*, achieved international success, with gold- and platinum-level sales around the world. Since then, he has continued to produce award-winning albums and has recorded music in Spanish, English, Italian, and Portuguese.



◀ **César L. Álvarez** César L. Álvarez moved to Miami from Cuba as a teenager. He is now the president and CEO of one of the largest law firms in the United States, Greenberg Traurig. Since he became president of the law firm in 1997, the number of lawyers working for the firm has more than quadrupled, and they have added offices in Europe and Asia. Greenberg Traurig employs many talented Hispanic lawyers. In addition to his success in business, Álvarez is an active community leader, involved in cultural and charitable organizations such as the United Way of Miami-Dade, the Florida International University Foundation, and Our Kids, Inc.
